



Dr. John Szarek is Professor of Pharmacology in the Department of Basic Sciences and Director of Clinical Pharmacology at Geisinger Commonwealth School of Medicine in Scranton PA, US. He also is Education Director for Simulation at Geisinger Commonwealth, a Certified Healthcare Simulation Educator and co-leader for the Interprofessional Education curriculum thread. Dr. Szarek received his Ph.D. in Pharmaceutical Sciences from the University of Kentucky College of Pharmacy, a B.S. in Pharmacy from the University of Illinois Chicago College of Pharmacy, and a B.S. in Biology from the University of Illinois Urbana.
